The Council took up the proposed Business Support Program. Dollar General had been contacted as well as other businesses regarding participation. Costs of the discount program was discussed. The council will review the program prior to the next meeting.

The Mayor reviewed the City's possible participation in aggregation for municipal power.

Mayor McVey reported that he was securing costs for new garbage service for Atlanta.

The topic of the Rt. 4 project was discussed. The area was part of original Rt. 66, built in the twenties.

The development of the attraction will cost about \$8000. The City's share will be \$6000.
